## **One Bible Study to Salvation**

- 1. Please turn to 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 to learn the gospel. If you were the only person on earth, Jesus would have come and died, buried, and raised for you. (Show picture of Jesus "The Gospel Enacted.")
- 2. Please turn to Romans 3:23. Sin is breaking God's law (1 John 3:4). When we come to an age of knowingly breaking God's law, and choose to break it, we become a sinner and need a savior. Ezekiel 18:20 says we do not inherit our parents' sins. Therefore, a child sprinkled for Adam's inherited sin is not what the Bible teaches. A child is sinless. See Matthew 18:3; 2 Samuel 12:23. We are responsible for our own sins.
- 3. Now turn to Romans 6:23. My sins condemn me. How do you feel about that?
- 4. Turn to Romans 5:6, 8. Do you see what Christ has done for you? Turn to Romans 6:1-5, 17-18. Note that when we are baptized, we are baptized into His death. That's where He shed His blood (John 19:33-35). Hebrews 9:22 says, without shedding blood, there is no remission of sins. However, when we are baptized into His death, His blood washes away our sins (Acts 22:16). This is the born again experience of John 3:1-7 and Acts 2:38. This whole process is a re-enactment (form) of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection (show picture of the gospel re-enacted in baptism). Romans 6:17-18 states by doing so, we are made free from sin (old sins) and become the servants of righteousness.
- 5. Turn to Mark 16:15-16. Note that people are not saved just by believing. They must also be baptized to be saved (1 Peter 3:21).
- 6. Every sinner in the Bible was told to obey the gospel in this same manner (Acts 2:37-47). When they did, they were immediately added to His church family who continued to worship (Hebrews 10:25) and grow in their faith (2 Peter 1:5-11; 3:18).
- Baptized believers will continue to sin occasionally (not sinless, but sin less). However, when we do sin, we pray to God and He continues to forgive us (1 John 1:7, 9) with the promise of Heaven (Revelation 2:10).

With this knowledge, please turn to Acts 9:6; 22:16. Do you want to be baptized now and be saved? Show both pictures (the gospel enacted and the gospel re-enacted).
